Renew your boat registration... EASY AS 1, 2, 3

- 1. Renew online** Log on to www.boatoregon.com and click on the decal image or renew online now link. Enter your certificate number and PIN (see below). While you're there, you can also update your address and contact information. The online receipt is a 30-day permit, so you can get your boat on the water right away.
- 2. Renew by mail** Return the remittance slip below along with a check or money order for registration fee due (see amount below) in the enclosed postage paid envelope.
- 3. Renew in person** Visit your nearest agent and renew in person to receive a temporary permit allowing you get your boat back on the water. For a complete list of agents and locations, log on to www.boatoregon.com.

An original Oregon title released and dated by the owners of record or a completed Lost Boat Title Application must be submitted to apply for a transfer of ownership from one Oregon resident to another.
